In 2017, PNAP partnered with Northeastern IL University's University Without Walls program to offer a bachelor's degree program at Stateville. Each semester, UWW offers art, poetry and a mix of courses. Classes are not-for-credit but, for students who are in the UWW program, classes help them build competency toward their degree. In addition to offering 13 classes, we facilitate a think-tank and tutoring program.
